




My Choices Careers Leader Guide



Introduction

What is the My Choices programme about?

The end of Year 11, Year 13 or the end of college, the build-up and immediate response to results days are a challenging time for many young people. Faced with sometimes difficult or scary decisions about their next steps, many students need guidance with their thinking, particularly if plans need to change.

This guide is designed to be a one-stop shop for information and resources to support all staff involved in supporting students on and around results days, with links to providers in the transition space, the most up to date resources and the latest national Labour Market Information.

The guide is something for you to also use across the whole of the next year as you prepare your future cohorts for transition phases too. The resources in the guide are grouped for teachers and for students, as well as post 16 and post 18 so that you can find the most appropriate resource to support a particular to cohort or individual need.

Engaging your students

Please make sure your school/college leavers are aware of this event so that they can participate and benefit from this opportunity. We appreciate that this cohort could be difficult to engage as they are no longer on roll but here are a few ideas as to how you could engage them:



- 2. The introduction of young people's hubs where young people can access wider support.
- 3. For young people with more complex needs, there will be an expansion of the Youth Employability Coaches model.
