

Computer Systems to maintain safe and secure waters as
well as conducting peace keeping and maritime security
operations around the world.



## **TRAINING**

Training and development are continuous throughout your career within the Royal Navy. It takes place at onshore training facilities and onboard operational ships. On joining, you'll complete 10 weeks of Basic Training (phase 1) at HMS Raleigh, where you'll gain skills that will stay with you throughout your career. After that, you'll go on to complete three months (phase 2) sub-specialisation (AWT, AWW, EW, or UW) training at the Maritime Warfare School at HMS COLLINGWOOD, which is based in Fareham, Hampshire.

#### **Joining**

- Naval Service Recruit Test (NSRT) and interview at your local Armed Forces Careers Office (AFCO)
- Telephone call with a triage nurse to prepare you for medical
- Medical and eye test
- · Pre-Naval Fitness Test
- Pre-Royal Navy Acquaint Course (RNAC)

# Once I start my application, how long will it take until I commence my initial training?

If you meet the required standard during the Recruit Test, Interview, Medical and Security Clearance your Careers Advisor within your Armed Forces Careers Office will be able to inform you of the date you will commence your training at HMS RALEIGH.

# How will I be streamed into a sub-specialisation with the Warfare Specialist branch?

Once you have completed all your mandated joining requirements you will be given a date for phase 1 training at HMS RALEIGH and you will be informed in either week 8 or 9 of training which sub-specialisation you have been streamed (AWT/AWW/EW/UW).

### ABOVEWATER WARFARE WEAPONS (AWW)

Being an Abovewater Warfare Weapons, Warfare Specialist means you would be the first and often the last line of defence onboard. Protecting the Ship and friendly assets from Air and Surface attacks, you will be trained to operate state-of-the-art Weapon and Missile systems onboard. At the start of your career you will be employed as part of the armed Ship's Protection Force when alongside as well as the Response Force, manning the Close Range Weapons at sea. As you progress in the Royal Navy you will be required to assist in Boarding Operations, direct the Medium Range Gun, become the expert in Naval Military Training onboard and utilise both the Ship's Air Defence and Surface missile systems. Maintaining Maritime Security globally means you could be required to conduct a wide range of tasks, from complex combat operations to being called upon at short notice to defend the Ship operating the formidable array of Weapons onboard.

#### **ELECTRONIC WARFARE (EW)**

ACTIVE ON:





Royal Navy Electronic Warfare involves using specialist equipment to intercept and analyse electromagnetic (Radar) emissions to determine their identity. Once you have discovered what the radar is, you can work out what Ship, Aircraft or Submarine it is fitted to, assess its weapon systems and its intent, therefore what threat it poses to your Ship. Building a tactical picture of what's around us without giving away our position, contributing to the UKs Maritime Security understanding, globally, to achieve offensive and defensive effects. You will use equipment to reduce and/or prevent adversaries use of their radars, while ensuring we can use our radars effectively to gain tactical advantage. As your career progresses you will become an expert in Anti-Ship Missile Defence, in control of Jaunching Counter Measures to defeat incoming threats keeping your Ship safe and operating effectively.

You will be trained how to operate the most advanced SONAR systems in the world and will be an essential part of the Warfare team. Trained to recognise the unique characteristics of these highly sophisticated vessels you will be able to detect and track submarines to safeguard our Aircraft Carriers and Nuclear Deterrent. You will be part of an elite team of 'Sub-Hunters' playing a dangerous game of cat and mouse using your NVQ accredited analytical skills to provide information that will enable the Command to make tactical decisions. If you believe you have what it takes to be a 'Sub-Hunter' whilst travelling the world and making lifelong friends along the way, then the UW branch is for you.
