LOGISTICS - THE HEARTBEAT OF THE ROYAL NAVY

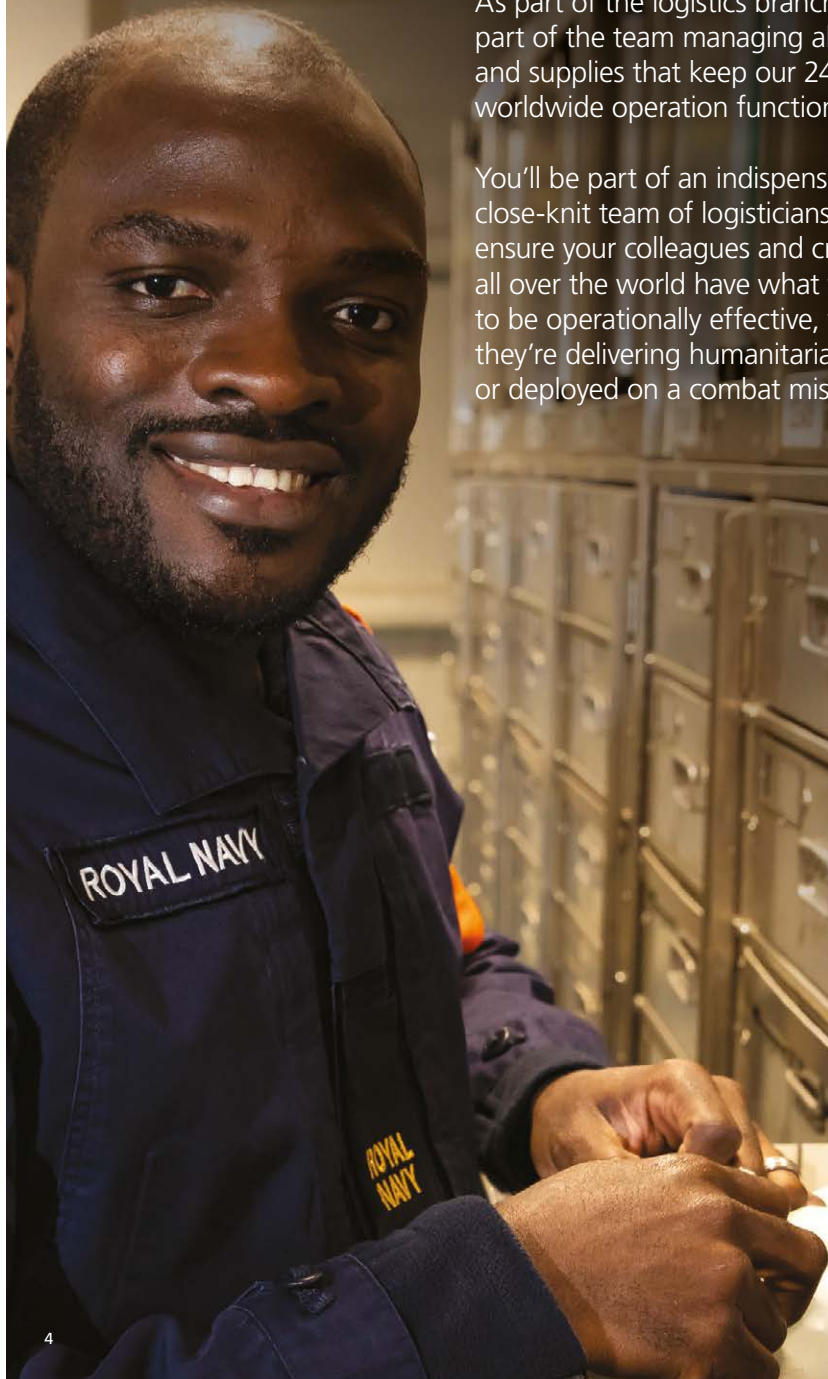
Across every service, our people rely on Logisticians for vital support. We're a global organisation of around 30,000 people, and you'll be part of the team responsible for providing everything they need to do their jobs. Your crew mates depend on you to deliver support operationally and personally.

From the Chefs who cook three meals a day, Logistics Officers who coordinate essential supplies, to Writers who look after the welfare of the crew and legal matters – logisticians keep us running smoothly. It's a level of responsibility you won't find in many jobs.

SUPPORTING OPERATIONS

As part of the logistics branch you'll be part of the team managing all the people and supplies that keep our 24-hour worldwide operation functioning.

You'll be part of an indispensable close-knit team of logisticians who ensure your colleagues and crewmates all over the world have what they need to be operationally effective, whether they're delivering humanitarian aid or deployed on a combat mission.





Be an invaluable part of the behind the scenes team who keep the ships company running smoothly from HR operation to legal matters and administration.

Training

Training and development continues throughout your career with the Royal Navy. It takes place in two distinct environments: at on shore training facilities and on board operational ships. On joining you complete 10 weeks of basic naval training, followed by role-specific training.

We'll help you gain academic qualifications like GCSEs, A-Levels and even a degree. You'll gather NVQs/Apprenticeships and other vocational awards throughout your career. As well as helping you develop your Royal Navy career, everything you achieve is recognised by employers too.

From phase two training you will receive the Intermediate Apprenticeship in Business Administration (Logistician Writer) or Warehouse Management (Logistician Supply Chain).

Skills for life include

- Intermediate Apprenticeships in Business Administration (Writer) or Warehouse Management (Supply Chain)
- Level 1 Functional Skills in Maths, English and ICT
- Study for GCSEs, A-Levels, NVQs or a degree
- Further qualifications as your career progresses





CATERING SERVICES

In catering you'll be at the heart of your ship or submarine's crew, providing food and service for everyone on board as well as visiting dignitaries.



Training

Training and development continues throughout your career with the Royal Navy. It takes place in two distinct environments: at on shore training facilities and on board operational ships. When you join, you complete 10 weeks of basic naval training, and up to 27 weeks of role specific training focusing on:

- Different types of catering and front of house provision to match the diverse requirements of the job
- Food hygiene
- Health and safety
- Stock control
- Catering and fund accountancy

We'll help you gain academic qualifications like GCSEs, A-Levels and even a degree. You'll gather NVQs/Apprenticeships and other vocational awards throughout your career. As well as helping you develop your Royal Navy career, everything you achieve is recognised by employers too.

From phase two training you will receive the Intermediate Apprenticeship in Hospitality Services or Professional Cookery.



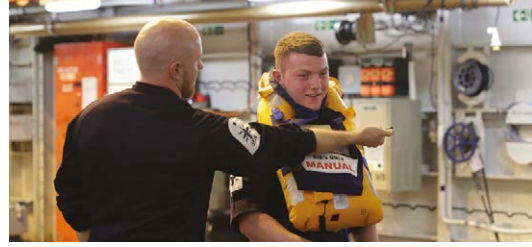
