Engineering and Manufacturing Technologies

All civilian industries, from printing to car-making, depend on complex machinery. The same is true of the Royal Navy, with its warships, submarines, aircraft, vehicles and weapon systems. Through your engineering apprenticeship, you'll learn everything you need to know about maintaining them.

ADVANCED APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME (MARINE / WEAPON ENGINEER)

If you are aged between 17-21, have 3 grade C GCSEs in Maths, English language and Science, a NQF Level 3 Diploma (120 credit) in either Mechanical or Electrical Engineering at merit level, you could be eligible to join on the Advanced Apprenticeship Scheme. You would start your career as a probationary Leading Engineer Technician on a much higher starting salary, with more responsibility in a varied and challenging career.

UNDERGRADUATE APPRENTICESHIP SCHEME (UGAS (MESM/WESM))

If you have 5 grade C GCSEs, in Maths, English language and Science, 160 UCAS points gained from Level 3 Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematic (STEM) qualifications then you could be eligible to join the Undergraduate Apprenticeship Scheme. Available for Marine Engineering Submariners (MESM) and Weapon Engineer Submariners (WESM) it provides an accelerated scheme which will see you undertake a BEng(hons) degree during your tailored 8½ year contract.

WEAPONS ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN

During your Level 2 Apprenticeship in Performing Engineering Operations, you'll be trained in electrical, electronic and mechanical engineering, as well as safe working practices. Your next step is a Level 3 Apprenticeship in Engineering Maintenance.

AIR ENGINEERING TECHNICIAN/ AIR SURVIVAL TECHNICIAN

As an Air Engineering Technician or Air Survival Technician, you'll complete a Level 2 Apprenticeship in Aircraft Engineering Manufacture, preparing you for specialist training in mechanical technology, avionics or specialist survival equipment, leading to a possible foundation degree course.

As an Aircraft Handler, you'll complete a Level 2 Apprenticeship in Aviation Operations on the Ground. You'll be trained to use the lifts, mechanical handlers, chocks and lashings used on board ships. You'll also learn to fight fuel, hangar and aircraft fires. As an Air Crewman or Aircraft Controller, you'll move straight onto the Level 3 Aviation Operations on the Ground Apprenticeship.

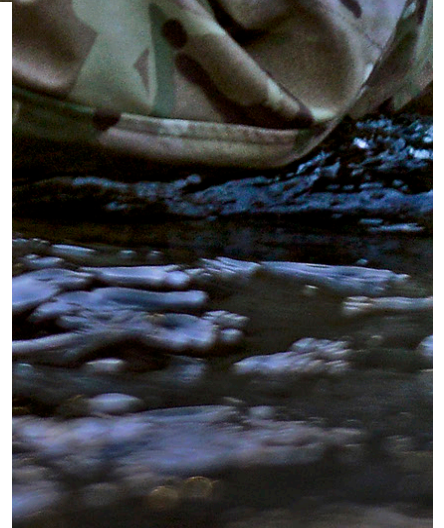




TRAIN WITH THE BEST
