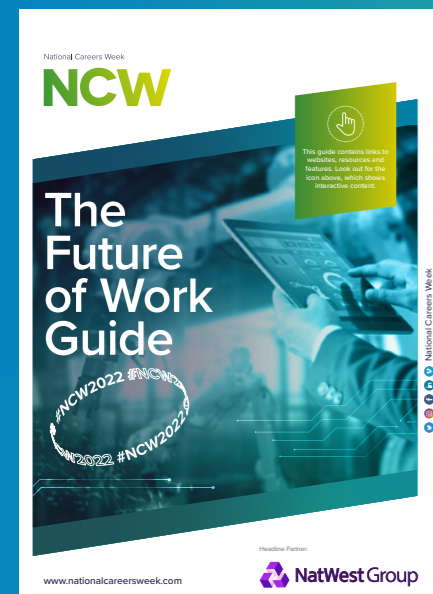

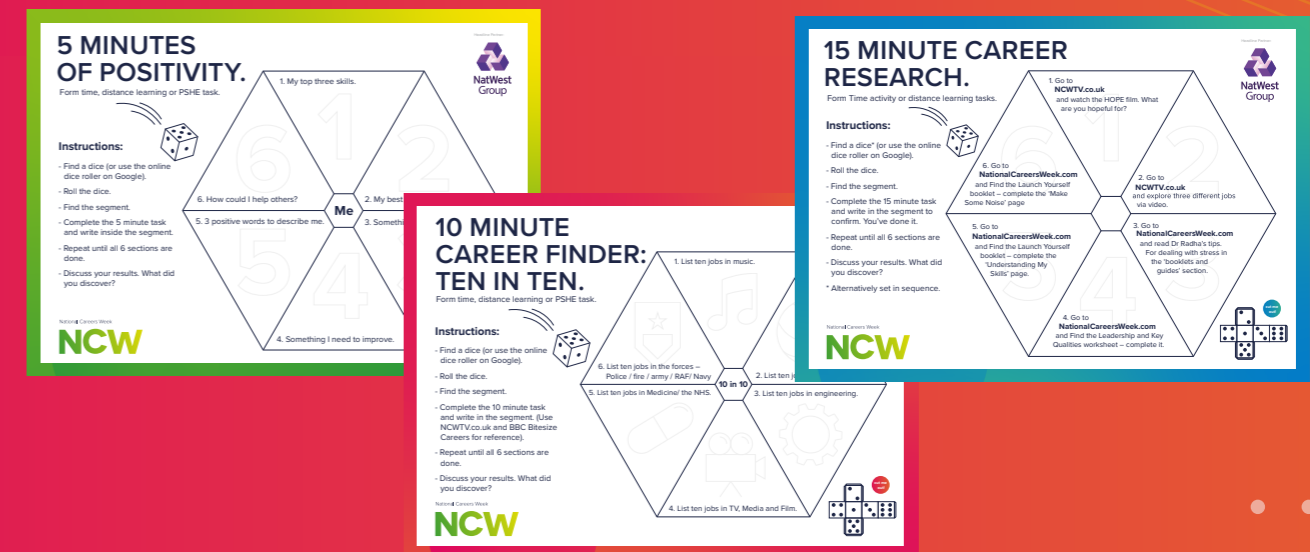


Five, ten and fifteen minute Careers games

Partner Article

Here is the first in a series of articles written by our partners.

One of our new partnerships for NCW2022 is with the Government's Civil Service – the

team behind the scenes in Government whose roles exist to enact the decisions made by the Government of the day across the UK.



Pathways into the Civil Service

Chris Richardson, Deputy Director Service Delivery at Government Business Services, explores new routes for school leavers to enter the Civil Service.

Does a career in the Civil Service, and becoming a civil servant, conjure up an image of a man wearing a bowler hat, and carrying a briefcase in Whitehall near Parliament?

The reality is very different. The UK Civil Service is a modern employer and employs 450,000 people across the UK, from Glasgow and Newcastle, to Norwich and

Cardiff. It assists the Government to develop and implement policies that affect everyone's lives¹. Civil servants are a diverse group of public servants, who come from all backgrounds, and are not linked to one political party or another.

The job roles in the Civil Service are broad and range from working in administrative support, as a prison officer and caterer, in policy development and implementation through to project management, HR, finance, IT, law and communications.

Serving the public

All civil servants are accountable to ministers, who in turn are accountable to Parliament, and the public, and sign up to a Civil Service Code. The code outlines the standards of behaviour expected of all civil servants, including:

- **'Integrity'** is putting the obligations of public service above your own personal interests
- **'Honesty'** is being truthful and open
- **'Objectivity'** is basing your advice and decisions on rigorous analysis of the evidence
- **'Impartiality'** is acting solely according to the merits of the case and serving equally well governments of different political persuasions²

New career paths

There are many ways to start a career in the Civil Service, including apprenticeships, and Movement to Work placements. Movement to Work placements started in The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) in 2013, and has since expanded across government, meaning that the Civil Service is one of the largest providers of work placement opportunities for young people in the UK³.

Debbie Alder, Director General of HR, DWP, said

"Time and time again we hear about the confidence Movement to Work placements give people, and how they break the cycle of not having the experience or skills to open an opportunity."

Placement opportunities often lead to permanent roles, and allow individuals to network, gain confidence and experience working life 'on the job.' Training is offered throughout a civil servant's career, and as a fluid organisation, colleagues can move around departments and experience new areas of work, policies and work in different teams and professions.

The Civil Service wants to engage school-leavers from across the UK, from backgrounds, to think about a future career path within the organisation. The Civil Service wants to reflect the communities it serves and open up opportunities to individuals, in particular those who may have previously felt excluded. The Cabinet Office recently celebrated being named in the top 25 organisations in the UK, within the 2021 Social Mobility Employer Index⁴, which shows how open an employer is to talent from all social backgrounds.

As an employer of choice, the Civil Service is developing an inclusive and talented workforce, by upskilling individuals with on-the-job training and encouraging drive, confidence and ambition.
